Cincinnati Cancer Foundation Announces Title Sponsors for Sold Out “Bearcats & Musketeers vs. Cancer” Golf Outing and “An Evening with Anthony Munoz” Event

Signature Sports-Themed Event to Tee Off at Clovernook Country Club on August 29, 2022

CINCINNATI – [July 1, 2022] – Today, the Cincinnati Cancer Foundation (CCF) announced the sell out of its second-annual “Bearcats & Musketeers vs. Cancer” golf outing. This year’s event will also be combined with the highly anticipated “An Evening with Anthony Munoz” dinner, featuring the Cincinnati Bengals’ NFL Hall-of-Fame offensive tackle, as well as former Bengal and current Bengals broadcaster Dave Lapham. The pair will reflect on last year’s momentous Bengals season, and give their bird’s-eye view of the upcoming season, distilled from their broadcast booth observations in the Bengals preseason, which concludes two days before on August 27th.

The golf outing will once again pay homage to the intense rivalry between the University of Cincinnati and Xavier University, which plays out annually on the hardcourt in one of the premier crosstown-rivalry games in any sport. The “Presenting Sponsor” for the event is Kroger Health, with other title sponsors consisting of Griffin Elite Sports & Wellness, Cushman & Wakefield and Urban Sites.

“We were thrilled with last year’s response to this new concept of harnessing the energy surrounding this in-city rivalry to combat the common enemy of cancer. Despite overwhelming progress in cancer research and treatment in recent years, this disease still claims more than 600,000 American lives annually, and more than 11,000 of our Greater Cincinnati neighbors will be diagnosed with this tenacious disease each year,” said Cincinnati Cancer Advisors’ founder Dr. William Barrett.

CCF has renewed its support for both the University of Cincinnati (UC) and Xavier University (XU) through the event and will commit \$50,000 of the proceeds to fund the upcoming “*Charge Against Cancer*” event at UC on August 26, 2022. This unique program, whose theme is “defeating cancer in Cincinnati through prevention, education and youth athletics,” will engage young people in the fight against cancer by using sports to educate, mentor, and drive interest in science and health-related careers. This will be accomplished with the support of both UC and XU student mentors pursuing education-related studies at their respective universities.

In reflecting on this year’s golf outing and dinner event, Bengals’ great Anthony Munoz, and Founder of the Anthony Munoz Foundation, said “I am even more excited about this year’s event as it will directly

benefit the youth of our great city; a cause that the Anthony Munoz Foundation has been committed to for more than two decades.”

In addition to the evening program described above, the “An Evening with Anthony Munoz” dinner will also feature a speed painter, video presentations, award presentations, and a one-of-a-kind live auction. The “Most Valuable Golfer” as chosen by the Tournament Director will receive a custom-made blazer from Cincinnati’s renowned menswear retailer – Hellman’s and Hellman’s Clothiers – conferring bragging rights to the reigning event champion until next year’s winner is crowned.
